Wildfire Trauma Relief Concert to Benefit Sonoma Charter and Three Other Local Sonoma Valley Nonprofits

Nationally renowned pianist Richard Glazier, best known for his work on PBS, will present his show, "Our Love Is Here To Stay: The Music of George and Ira Gershwin" on Saturday, March 10th at the Hanna Auditorium on the campus of Hanna Boys Center.

The event, a wildfire trauma relief concert, will raise funds to support local non-profit organizations leading wildfire trauma recovery and resiliency projects for children and education in the Sonoma Valley region.

All of the proceeds from ticket sales, and a \$100,000 grant match offered by the Nelsons, will go directly to the beneficiary organizations Sonoma Valley Mentoring Alliance, Boys & Girls Club. Hanna Institute and Sonoma Charter School. All donations and ticket purchases are 100% tax deductible.

Producers and underwriters for the event are Gary and Marcia Nelson, long-time supporters of live performing arts and education. The Nelsons are currently supporting a trauma informed care program through the Hanna Institute. The program is also in place at Sonoma Charter School.

"When I realized the extent of the trauma affecting our students and families as a result of the October fires, we wanted to put together something that would help the families and the nonprofits supporting them," said Gary Nelson. "Music and storytelling are soothing. Richard's personal story is inspiring to young kids.

I thought if we could offer that AND raise money for the local groups helping our kids, then the event would be a win-win.'

"Gary and I have offered a \$25,000 match to each nonprofit," Marcia Nelson stated. "The \$100,000 grant has the potential to generate \$200,000 for resiliency development and trauma support when matched.

How Our Classroom Data Dashboards will help drive instructional Planning in the third Trimester

Last Friday's Teacher Workday was dedicated to a Professional Development Data Workshop by our Instructional Coaches, Deena Reyes and Marian Rasmussen.

The Classroom Data Dashboard served as a collection point for important data related to each student in a given class. In addition to demographic and program/service information, the Dashboard provided space for teachers to record results from the three types of assess-

ments students take each trimester (using a common rubric):

- Reading Assessments (STAR Reading / Early Lit)
- Adaptive Reading Support (Lexia)
- Math Assessments (ADAM / DOMA)
- Adaptive Math Support (Dream Box)
- English & Math Performance Tasks (CAASPP practice)


